

Primary Swimming Lessons Casino Christian School 2018

Dear Parents/Caregivers

Our school swimming lessons begin on Monday (12 February, 2018).

This is part of our Term 1 Physical Education Program. All primary students (Years 1-6) will participate in a series of lessons, each Monday afternoon after an **early lunch**, with our last planned day at the pool to be Monday 26 March.

We make swimming lessons a priority in our programming.

This is for water safety reasons: swimming is a part of many social activities in our location and culture. There is no additional payment required for your child(ren) to participate in these lessons as all costs are included in the school fees.

It is important for students to attend all lessons.

If at any time your child is unable to participate, a note must be given to their class teacher at the beginning of the day. If you choose to withdraw your child from this activity, please collect your child early: either from school at 12:30pm or from the Casino pool at 1:00pm.



Children will travel to and from school as on any other school day.

Swimming lessons are held in school time. A hired bus will transport children and teachers to the Casino Pool, leaving the school at 12:50pm. All children and teachers will board buses again at 2:30pm to return to the school. As such, the lessons will run from 1:15pm to 2:15pm on Mondays.

Children need to bring their swimming gear to school each Monday.

They need to bring their swimmers, a towel, thongs, and sun protection cream to school, all in a separate bag (supermarket green bags are ideal, but supermarket plastic bags tend to break). Goggles are optional. Students wear their sports uniform to school, and change into their swimmers at the pool.

Please WRITE YOUR CHILD'S NAME clearly on all of your child's belongings.

This includes **all** swimming gear and **all** uniform items. They will be told to put socks inside shoes.

The children will be organised into groups based on their current abilities, catering for all students from beginners to competent swimmers. These levels are based on the Royal Life Saving Program. Students will receive instruction that includes opportunities for skill development, practice and refinement. Three trained swimming coaches will work alongside the Casino Christian School class teachers to enable all students to extend their swimming abilities.

This is a great opportunity for you to assist your child(ren) in taking responsibility for themselves.

Work together with your child(ren) to **remind each other** that swimming lessons are on Mondays, so that their swimming gear is ready for them to take to school each Monday morning.

Encourage your child(ren) to make the most of these lessons. They will have a wonderful time!

Written orders are taken for lunches only. Children are to queue and purchase their own recess.
